Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. This also includes children who are eligible for FSM in the last six years (known as the Ever Six Measure.) Schools are free to spend their Pupil Premium allocation as they see fit.

Aims

Our aims are to diminish the difference between Pupil Premium funded pupils and 'other' pupils:

- Ensure PP attainment tracking and monitoring is robust and used to inform subsequent provision;
- Continue to support families and pupils' social, emotional and health needs;
- PP pupils make rapid progress to catch up to their peers;
- More able PP pupils are on track to exceed the expected standard in reading, writing and maths;
- Improve school readiness and pupils' enjoyment through providing clubs and subsidising trips.
